

Movie Level Difficulty Description in Using English Mate

Level 1

Learners have to learn about 1,000 to 1,500 basic vocabulary words and be accustomed to different kinds of English accents. They also need to have basic communication skills, being able to understand contexts by listening. These are minimum requirements for learners to be able to use English Mate efficiently.

Level 1 movies are mostly animation and those with easy vocabularies, slow speaking speed, and a simple story. This way, learners can follow or guess the content of characters' conversations without difficulty. Furthermore, these movies also teach moral lessons and values for learners to understand naturally.

Level 2

Level 2 movies focus on general vocabularies and sentence structures, which can be used in daily conversation. Quizzes will also have questions which require comprehension and gathering information to answer. They teach learners to think critically. There are about 2,500 vocabulary words in this level. Those who pass this level will be able to use English in daily life to certain extent.

Movies in this level have more difficult vocabularies but not advanced. Sentence structures are commonly used in daily life. Learners can adapt the sentences to their own situations and use them in their daily conversations.

Level 3

In this level, movies have contents of various kinds. Learners can use vocabularies found in the movies to explain things in more details. Moreover, questions in quizzes now mainly focus on critical thinking skill in the area of plots and word choice. Sentence structures are also complex. This level will help learners be to use English in their daily lives more meaningfully and appropriately.
